GAS TRADES - SCHEDULE "A"

Item	Category	Requirement
1.	Meter Set Assembly	Comprehension and attention to detail, ability to follow a written standard and construct the meter set to the standard, manual dexterity, ability to follow written instruction, strength to tighten.
2.	Pipefitting	Comprehension, attention to detail, manual dexterity, cut, ream, and thread piping, test for thread quality, demonstrate ability to work with both hands, standing for a period of up to 45 minutes, strength to turn threader.
3.	Excavating	Strength and stamina to dig constantly with a pick and shovel for up to 1 hour while maintaining a positive disposition and good work attitude, ability to follow instruction.
4.	Wiring	Comprehension and attention to detail, ability to follow written instructions, mechanical aptitude, wire up a test board.
5.	Physical Fitness Examination	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lift a 46 lbs. meter, carry it up a stairway (two reps) • Remove a 51 lbs. ladder from a ladder rack, place the ladder against the wall and replace the ladder on the rack. • Squat or kneel or combine both actions for a period of 10 minutes while removing and assembling bolts on a jig. • Loosen flange bolts torqued to 125 ft/lbs. and re-torque for next candidate. • Install a mustang squeezer on a 2" riser and squeeze off the pipe. • Use a 13 lbs. plunger bar to plunge 4 holes into the ground 40 inches deep and remove. • Lift a 77.5 lbs. Williamson valve of the back of a truck and carry it 30' into a trench, then remove from the trench and carrying it back 30' to the truck.
6.	Measuring	Comprehension and attention to detail, ability to accurately measure a series of piping nipples that are connected.
7.	Interview	Ability to demonstrate the competencies at the required skills level. The competencies include but are not limited to: Customer Service, Results Oriented and Decision Making. Behavioral-based questions will also be included.
